| General comments | <p>A brighter more natural light would be of benefit to residents/visitors.</p> <p>We will ensure that lights are fitted in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations, to provide a consistent level of lighting across the communal areas, without patches of shadow.</p> <p>The LED lighting currently is for installation in the communal areas only; therefore, there potentially could be a contrast in light from the communal area to the residents property. If tenants have concerns, the council would provide guidance on how to change the lighting within their own property.</p> <p>LED lighting operate silently, whereas fluorescent lighting produce a low buzzing sound.</p> <p>LED lighting is instant and therefore provides optimum illumination levels.</p> <p>Bright light can have an effect on individuals with cataracts in that if an individual was to look at LED lights for concerted periods (many hours), the blue part of the spectrum can cause issues. LED lighting has the same impact as daylight and we will monitor any complaints in relation to this and consider at stage 3.</p> | |
