| SKMP15 | South Kesteven District Council                                       | South Kesteven | £100,000    | <p>This one-off project will create a grant fund for business based in the town Centre areas of Grantham, Bourne, Stamford and Market Deeping (as defined by the Local Plan), which will support business owners in maintaining their shopfronts and bringing them into line with applicable shopfront design guidance.</p>   |
| SKMP16 | National Trust (Belton Estate)  | Belton         | 105,000     | <p>We wish to set up a community Hub at Grantham house. Working in Partnership with St Wulfram's and the local community, Grantham House will become an amazing community space for the people of Grantham and beyond. The Property will bring the local community together and provide a great facility for community groups to use as well as to hold community engagement. This new project builds on some of the work that has already taken place.</p> |



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| SKMP17  | inspire+                      | South Kesteven | 15,500  | Promoting active travel to school and in the community for local young people and their families. The focus of this project will be to encourage families to use active travel as their mode of transport for travel to school and other journeys, whilst also providing training and resources to empower schools to deliver training. This project will have long-lasting impact on young people, families, schools, and the local community.   |
| SKMP18  | inspire+                      | South Kesteven | £4,000  | This project will develop a Business Skills Academy in South Kesteven, working with local businesses to provide opportunities for young people in the local area to develop their skills for the workplace. This will be delivered in conjunction with local secondary schools across South Kesteven, including Bourne, Deepings, Grantham, and Stamford.   |
| SKMP19  | Destination Lincolnshire      | South Kesteven | 160,900 | This is an integrated programme for the visitor economy. The project has three interventions of business support and training, destination marketing and product development / itinerary building. The project will be delivered in 2025/24. Whilst it is a one-off project for South Kesteven, but forms part of a wider visitor economy programme that Destination Lincolnshire is delivering as the LVEP for Lincolnshire. Our programme will be open to all economically inactive residents in South Kesteven but will be designed to meet the needs and remove barriers of the cohorts identified above.  |

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| RF-1006 | Storm Style Ltd                    | Stamford      | £60,023.16 | This project is obtaining new and better equipment with improved printing abilities, for the shop in project. This project is to improve the quality of our products, lower costs to production, and increase production speed.  |
| RF-1008 | Claypole Village Store             | Claypole      | £55,000    | We wish to install a new roof, solar panel with battery storage. wiring, suspended ceiling LED lights, new shelving. Energy efficient glass door fridge-freezer. New flooring, Epos system till. Shop front with electric sliding door etc. It's basically, it's in need of complete internal refitting required.  |
| RF-1013 | JJ Holdings                        | Great Gonerby | £50,000    | We wish to set up a secure, safe dog exercise park, in one of our least productive fields on the outskirts of Great Gonerby. The incidence of dog ownership has exploded off the back of the pandemic, however people's working situation has changed with many people going back to work on site, rather than working from home. This has led to a need for dog walkers and secure off lead parks where dogs can run free and exercise themselves in a secure and safe environment, and not require hours of restricted exercise. |
| RF-1014 | St Andrew's Church, Irnham         | Irnham        | £4,000     | Replacement of 7 quoin stones on southeast corner of C13th bell tower and 5sq m of stone to be cut out and replaced on south elevation.  |
| RF-1015 | Fairman Knight and Sons UK Limited | Grantham      | £45,000    | This project aims to transform Lincolnshire agriculture by introducing sustainable insect production at the industrial farm-scale, tackling the environmental and economic issues stemming from reliance on imported animal feed. With a focus on cultivating Black Soldier Flies, the initiative proposes a local, sustainable protein source and eco-friendly fertiliser, substantially reducing the carbon footprint and repurposing food waste into valuable resources at the farm level.                                      |



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| RF-1016 | Rural Inc Ltd                    | Grantham         | £10,000 | The proposal intends to provide an open-space secure and safe area where dogs can be exercised 'off-the-lead'. Owners can relax knowing their pets are secure and have ample space to explore within a controlled environment. The exercise area will be privately hired to dog owners (typically) on a half hourly basis.                                       |

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| RF-1021 | Mannakin Ltd                          | Grantham  | £100,000   | We wish to seek funds for the removal of 2 asbestos roofs and replace them with new roofs. The roofs nearly 100 years old, of an asbestos material, and need replacement. Our business hire's mannequins into the TV, Fashion, Film & Media industries with much success. Since the pandemic, via fantastic PR, we've been discovered globally to visitors.  |
| RF-1022 | Posh Paws Luxury Animal Hotel Limited | Stubton   | £40,000    | Replacement of business energy using fossil fuel (oil-fuelled heating and on-grid electricity) to renewable energy, namely two air source heat pumps (ASHP) supported by solar panels. The system will generate more energy than needed during summer, facilitating storage of surplus into batteries, which will be used during peak times and night-time.  |
| RF-1023 | Vale Honey Ltd                        | Foston    | £20,301.66 | To allow for the expansion of Vale Honey new premises (Unit 1 Top Farm Foston) have been acquired.<br>The aim of the project and purpose of the investment is to: Replace the floor in the premises with a commercial grade epoxy covering to ensure the food preparation area is floor is compliant with the requirements of regulation 852/2004. Clad the walls in a robust and hygienic covering that complies with the requirements of regulation 852/2004. Seal the ceiling and install suitable lighting with food safe covers and sufficient lighting to comply with 852/204. Widen the doorway and install a roller shutter type door of atleast 1.3m wide. Install commercial equipment capable of processing 15000Kg of honey. |
| RF-1024 | Mannakin Ltd                          | Grantham  | £25,000    | We wish to upgrade our staff kitchen and bar area so that customers and clients who are visiting our location, may seek refreshments whilst they are here. | SK-2158 | Market Deeping Town Council: Neighbourhood Plan Group | Market Deeping | £30,000 | The primary purpose of the Deepings Green Walk is to promote healthy living and outdoor activity for people of all ages. Objectives include protecting and establishing more delightful green spaces, securing additional accessible pathways throughout our neighbourhood, and encouraging active lifestyles for residents and visitors. This project funding application is to support the development of the Deepings Green Walk by introducing signage for the Deepings nine mile outer circular route i.e through: - Installation of a set of 20 bespoke Way marker posts with directional arrows - Installation of a set of 10 Activity Trail marker posts along one section of the Green Walk - Installation of a set of 8 resting benches at key points around the Green Walk This application will be accompanied by a second funding application to produce a Wayfinder Map of the Deepings Green Walk giving the locations of Marker Posts, Activity Posts, Benches, and Information Boards. |

| SK-2160 | Uffington Parish Council                              | Uffington      | £13,500 | Our proposal is for a well mapped-out trail offering accessibility to all, encouraging the community to gain a better understanding of Uffington, to get outdoors and improve their well-being. This proposal would include a requirement for lecterns to showcase the trail route and give meaningful information to all that walk the trail, whether it is villagers or one of the many visitors to Uffington. We have a passion to make the Uffington Heritage Trail accessible and engaging to all, with factual information being delivered in both a serious and fun way to capture the widest possible audience.   |
| SK-2161 | Uffington Parish Council                              | Uffington      | £10,745 | We would like to enhance five green spaces in Uffington to bring in more nature and to enable more villagers to engage and access this. The five spaces are: 1. Uffington churchyard, Uffington school and Church Paddock 2. Allotments 3. Brickyard wood 4. Main Road verges and Bertie Lane Island 5. Play area and verges near Manners Close. We will run workshops for villagers to build bird and bat boxes, insect, and hedgehog houses for their own gardens to amplify the impact. We also want to offer four walks with local experts on various fauna and flora topics. We also want to offer every child in the village a i-spy nature book to get them engaged with nature and link with activities on social media that we will be developing.   |

| SK-2163 | Bourne Civic Society - Baldocks Mill | Bourne                                 | £15,000   | The programme will undertake a community owned review, develop community owned programme of cultural events within the town linked directly with existing scheduled events as well as sensitively planned new opportunities - all designed to increase visitor numbers. The project will focus on Baldocks Mill and will increase the engagement of community with the Museum's collection ensuring wider regional awareness of the heritage site is achieved. Working with staff, volunteers, students from local schools, community organisations and businesses to drive greater visitor numbers and increase the re-visit rates of visitors to the heritage site. The intended outcome from this is to increase the prestige and significance attached to heritage, the Museum and the role young people play in the life of their own surroundings. |
| SK-2164 | Ron Dawson Memorial Hall             | Corby Glen                             | £32,081.9 | Installation of a 20kW solar photovoltaic system at the Ron Dawson Memorial Hall. This will dramatically reduce (estimation 90% reduction) the electricity bills that the hall is liable for. Unfortunately, the hall does not have central heating and is totally reliant on storage heaters as the sole source of heating. The main user of the hall is the village pre-school, who require the hall to be heated all day (Mon-Fri all year round) to ensure the children are comfortable and safe. Given the huge increase in electricity prices, this has had a massive impact on the halls costs and has therefore had to pass on a percentage of this to the pre-school  |
| SK-2166 | West Deeping Village Hall            | West Deepings                          | £21,000   | New Flat Roof above Kitchen and refitted Kitchen with appliances. The Roof Leaks in kitchen and can cause problems to hirers and desperately needs reroofing. The kitchen is over 20 years old and needs refitting and we are keen to include cooking facilities This kitchen and hall are widely used for lots of local events and clubs, and it would be a great asset to have a new kitchen with cooking facilities as an example we hope to offer some lunches for elderly residents and use it for the benefit of our community who are keen to have this   |
| SK-2167 | Grantham Canal Society               | South Kesteven Grantham to Woolsthorpe | £30,000   | The Grantham Canal Society (GCS) would like to have a project that focuses on the stretch of the Grantham canal between Woolsthorpe-by-Belvoir and the A1 at Grantham. Our project involves clearing and maintaining this length of canal to remove silt and debris within the water course to encourage water flow and improve the depth and improve the habitat for fish and other canal habitants. Our project seeks funding to invest in a set of machinery (a boat and a set of attachments) that will dredge the length of the canal of silt and debris. Dredging a five-mile stretch of canal is a considerable undertaking, we have a group of dedicated volunteers with the skills and qualifications to undertake this work.   |



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| SK-2168 | Parochial Church Council of St. Stephen's Church                   | Carlby   | £50,000   | Connection of a water supply and accompanying drainage to the church building. Installation of disabled toilet facilities, storage, and servery, providing basic facilities to bring the building to a fit for purpose, suitable for multi-functional use in 2024. The lack of water and toilet facilities seriously hinders the use of building by both secular and non-secular groups. At present church attendees, including for weddings, funerals and christenings, as well as those attending our popular cultural events are obliged to walk 500m to locate facilities. Water for teas and coffees is carried in by hand. We desperately need a water supply and disabled toilet if we are to continue the multi-functional use of the building by all age groups in our rural community |
| SK-2169 | Baston Village Hall  | Baston   | £12,000   | The project involves the repair of the oldest part of the roof on Baston Village Hall and replace the worn and deteriorated small flat roof section with new material. Many local non-profit organisations and private hirers and adult exercise classes regularly use the Village Hall. Additionally, it is used by local football and cricket teams, the WI, Parish Council, Scouts and it is used as a Polling Station. Further deterioration of the roof and potential loss of the boiler system could render the Village Hall unsafe and unusable, a significant loss to Baston and its Community users. Repairs to the roof will ensure the longevity of the facility which is used by the Community and its many support organisations.  |
| SK-2172 | Stamford Drama and Music   | Thurlby  | £45,000   | A recent survey stated that arts activities provided in market towns often focuses on families with activities for young children. The key youth demographic (13–19-year-olds) are missed out, meaning they have a low engagement rate in the arts. We want to change that by using the voice in the design and development of a youth arts festival which will take place in Stamford and Grantham. We will make use of different public spaces, helping young people to connect with locations in their community, and to build local networks among their peers and likeminded artists.  |
| SK-2173 | Deepings Neighbourhood Plan Group/ Deeping St James Parish Council | Deepings | £21,600   | New east-west path through John Eve Field (broadly following public right of way, MaDe/4/2 ). Creation of hardened all-weather surface. 180m length. The field was donated to the Town Council by John Eve, a local farmer. Used extensively by all members of the community, it provides sports facilities via an informal football pitch along with a children's play area. A BMX track also exists. Whilst some hardened paths exist, they do not offer an east -west route. This new route will provide an all-weather route to connect pedestrians via Church, and cemetery on the west, to schools and supermarket on the east side of the park.  |
| SK-2175 | Langtoft Parish council  | Langtoft | 19,168.48 | The Parish Council want to visually unite the village and balance the amenities offered in each side of the village with two distinct Community Cohesion Projects. Project one: - We would like to install two signs on entry to the village one from both directions. Project two: - To continue with our  |

Last year it was identified that the older youths and young adults had little access to healthy activities nor an area to encourage community connections. Last year we received funding for six pieces of adult gym equipment which we installed three pieces in each of the two village parks. This has proved very successful, and more pieces of equipment are now in demand due to utilization.  |
| SK-2178 | St Martins<br>Stamford<br>Baron<br>Parochial<br>Church<br>Council | Stamford   | £15,000 | To install an accessible ramp into the Church, which will allow the Church to be more inclusive for worship, community group meetings, visiting tourist groups and school and special need groups. Without this project going ahead, the Church does have its limitations in that its current access is only a temporary fix and not acceptable. If the Church is to be used to its full potential we need to ensure that we are open, welcoming and accessible to all users.  |
| SK-2179 | National<br>Trust -<br>Woolsthorpe Manor                          | Colsterworth   | £6,000  | Woolsthorpe Manor is seeking funding to improve the pathways on site to help improve physical access for visitors. The property welcome over 30,000 visitors a year due to its historic and scientific significance with a number of those people with mobility issues, wheelchairs users or families with push chairs. During 2023 Woolsthorpe carried out extensive repairs to the lower courtyard which has greatly improved access to this part of the site. The second stage would be to improve pathways leading to the Manor House.   |
| SK-2180 | Art Pop-Up  | Great Gonerby/South<br>Witham/Billingborough/Morton &<br>Hanthorpe | £16,190 | A professional Artist will collaborate with these local communities, led by the Art Pop-Up team, to deliver a fun series of art events culminating in a cross between 'Free Art Friday' and a Treasure Hunt event in each village. The project will be repeated in each of the 4 villages. All activities will be free to participate in, benefitting residents of all ages, targeting families and seniors. Events between August and October 2024 estimated audience 1000. In each village: project commences with pre-event liaison and meetings with village groups, school, and the parish council to recruit residents. A subsequent social 'onboarding' event invites all the community to get involved, includes an introductory Artist's Talk and insights from the team. Following this, the artist leads 3 free community art/craft workshops to create small 'Treasures' for the Hunt. Local hobbyists and groups will contribute additional handcrafted gifts, showcasing diverse local talents. The culmination of the project is an Arts Treasure Hunt and party, where artworks and crafts made during workshops, and donated, along with around 100 special edition artworks by the Artist, are hidden throughout the village as gifts. A main venue hosts a small exhibition of other works and refreshments are provided for participants after the hunt. |



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| SK-2181 | Blackstones Sports and Social Club | Stamford | £300,000 | The project is to make the club more inclusive for everyone in the community regardless of age, gender, physical ability, or sporting prowess • Provide proper access for the disabled and infirm to the clubhouse and all facilities • Provide toilets to at least the current standard, in the right numbers and accessible to all • Provide changing rooms equally safely usable for all activities and by all participants • Provide gender separate facilities for the officials in charge • All of this to the guidelines of Sports England and the Netball and Football Associations • To increase the capability of the Club to provide a venue for local groups to meet and to maintain it as a community hub. |
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
