Grantham Canal Society	The funding application was for a project that focused on the stretch of the Grantham canal between Woolsthorpe by Belvoir and the A1 at Grantham. The project involved the clearing and maintaining of this length of canal to remove silt and debris within the water course to encourage water follow and improve the dept and improve the habitat for fish and other canal inhabitants	£30,000
Baston Village Hall	The funding request was for a project to repair the oldest part of the roof at Baston Village Hall and replace the worn and deteriorated small flat roof section with new material. The Hall was used regularly by the community as well as the local football and cricket teams.	£12,000
