- 2.1 To seek approval to enter into a contract with PVF Scaffolding for the provision of scaffolding to enable the Council to complete repairs and improvement works in a timely manner.
- 2.2 Scaffolding is currently requested on an ad-hoc basis which can lead to delays in response times and can also result in an additional cost to the Council. Entering into a formal contract will ensure the Council has a compliant and cost-effective solution where scaffolding is required for repairs and improvements works to be completed.
- 2.3 The Council is able to direct ward the contract to PVF Scaffolding via the EEM framework. The duration of the contract will be for a period of 2 years with a total contract value of £180k.
