SKMP35	South Kesteven District Council	Grantham	£52,500	This project will assess the demand for commercial spaces (office and industrial) in South Kesteven District, focusing on Grantham, Bourne, Stamford, Market Deeping, and other key areas. It will evaluate the current and proposed supply of commercial premises, analysing their type, size, quality, and age. Based on this supply and demand analysis, the project will identify specific quantitative and qualitative needs, both district-wide and for individual settlements. It will also determine the causes of any undersupply and explore options to address barriers, promoting development to meet identified commercial needs effectively.
RF-1031	Treescape Nursery	Sleaford	£55,000	To reduce reliance on EU imported plants, Treescape Nursery would like to build a one-off project consisting of a tall steel framed greenhouse type structure with temperature-controlled ventilation, alongside a germination room for young plants and a potting area.
SKMP16	National Trust Belton Estate	Grantham	£105,000	This project will support the provision of a community hub open to the public of South Kesteven free of charge throughout the year, offering opportunities to engage with nature, cultural heritage and wellbeing. This community venue enabling businesses and community groups to easily access both indoor and outdoor spaces in the town centre.
