SKMP42	SKDC – Brown Tourism Signs	Stamford	£40,000	Installation of two Brown Tourist Signs for Stamford along the A1 (one north-bound, one south-bound). Brown Tourist Signs are a national signage scheme to help road users find attractions and facilities. Town signs with generic symbols (such as museum, church, parking and information point) are proposed for Stamford as there are currently none installed. This is a one-off project. Once installed, tourist signs become the property of the relevant highway authority to maintain as required.
RF-1033	E-Badges Ltd	Stamford	£15,000	Innovation of off site manufacturing process: upgrading the production of badge machine casting from gravity die to high-pressure injection molding. Investment required for tooling. Upgrade to IT system to develop all areas off the business: Operations, Sales, Marketing and digital platforms.
RF-1034	Moto 101	Grantham	24,999	Purchasing a renewable power source. They are currently running of generator which is very costly and are also working hard with electric off-road bikes which we feel running a combustion engine to change them goes against the rule.
SK-2218	Stamford Indoor Bowls	Stamford	£42,720	Installation of 160 Longi HiMo6 Solar Panels to roof of Indoor Bowls Club to provide 69.6 kW of green electrical energy. This is coupled with 4 inverters and 4 storage batteries and has the facility to feed surplus energy back into the national grid. It is expected that completion of the project will enhance the building's value, durability and profitability. This will help provide a safe and welcoming environment for many people of all ages, genders and physical ability to continue to get gentle exercise and social interaction for maximum length of time possible.
SK-213	Bourne Town Council	Bourne	£24,200	The Town Council has for the past 30 years erected Christmas Lights in the town centre for the enjoyment of local residents and visitors. The lights are now 20 years old and the whilst the town would love to see new lights, the cost of this is proving to be prohibitive. To enable the lights to be productive for the ensuring years, the Town Council has decided to refurbish the ones they currently have and also purchase some additional ex rental lights.
