SKMP43	Steadfast Training	Stamford, Bourne and The Deepings	£36,050	The proposed project is an extension of Steadfast’s current Connect2Grow programme in South Kesteven, which is also funded by the UKSPF and which we have been delivering successfully since September 2024. The proposed extension of Connect2Grow will build on the current scheme and continue a locally integrated skills and employment service that tackles the deep-seated barriers to work for 2 distinct target groups of residents across Stamford, Bourne and The Deepings areas of South Kesteven.
SKMP44	Grantham College	Grantham	£20,500	This is an application to extend our work on the Employability and Skills Programme supporting individuals living in South Kesteven who are furthest from the labour market, often with significant barriers, to achieve their full potential and move them closer towards sustainable employment and/or into training, learning or volunteering opportunities.
SKMP45	SKDC CCTV		£8,000	This is an extension of the CCTV upgrade and relocation project, to include the addition of free Wi-Fi provision in SK managed Car Parks.
SKMP47	Deeping St James Parish Council	Deeping St James	£15,864.40	Public Notice Board replacements (x8). To improve communication with a rapidly growing population, the Council has decided to replace its outdated and poor-quality public notice boards. While digital communication is increasingly common, public notice boards remain an essential tool for local engagement. The current boards are beyond economic repair or restoration, and a grant will enable a significant and highly visible refresh of our public image. This upgrade will also enhance our ability to efficiently manage and maintain our expanding range of services.
SKMP48	Harlaxton Manor College	Grantham	£25,400	The proposal is to work with key actors and community organisations to scope the key components of a strategic plan to build capacity within South Kesteven's social economy. The

SK-2233	Grantham Squash and Fitness Centre	Grantham	£35,000	<p>Our project is to install a personnel lift to transport a visitor from the ground floor of the club to the first floor where social area, function room, fitness studio and squash court viewing galleries are situated. Access to use of a lift will benefit different groups from the community by enabling some individuals to reach the first floor of the club to attend a range of physical and social activities that take place during the week.</p>
SK-2236	SKDC re-wilding (extension of SK-2196)	Grantham	£14,489.60	<p>The project proposal is for an extensive biodiversity dog paddock in Wyndham Park, Grantham. This would have positive implications for biodiversity, improve the wellbeing of local residents, and would contribute to revenue and time savings for the Council's Grounds Maintenance team. A public consultation is also being planned for January due to the time sensitive nature of the application, given seasonal planting limitations.</p>
SK-2231	St Michael and All Angels church	Langtoft	£45,665	<p>Applying for grant funding to contribute towards the costs of providing an accessible toilet with baby change facilities and a servery that is fit for purpose with proper drainage.</p> <p>The proposed toilet and servery is felt to be increasingly necessary as the lack of toilet facilities is increasingly becoming an issue, the primary school visit regularly, and having a number of very young children on site with no facilities adds a level of stress to all involved in the visit. As in many places our regular congregation is quite elderly and again not having any facilities creates stress meaning that some church members won't stay for coffee after the service. Also, people who have travelled any distance to attend a wedding, baptism, or funeral would benefit from facilities being in the church.</p>
SK-2235	Hougham and Marston Village Hall	Grantham	£25,000	<p>To fund urgent and remediation works to a dearly loved Village Hall and Playing Field. Including:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. New entrance doors 2. Fix the leaking roof

The perimeter requires some gates to be added to ensure the usage is controlled and ideally needs to be split into an area around the hall for the casual user and booked users 8. SK-2155	St Lawrence Church, Tallington	Tallington	£10,088.92	<p>Renewal of lighting and heating inside the church</p> <p>Lighting- current lighting is by 5 overhead single lamps, The proposal is to replace these five lights with five bulb chandeliers to reach expected lumen levels.</p> <p>Heating - there are six overhead radiant heaters, 20ft above the pews. After being on for over two hours they are very ineffective, with heat rising towards the roof.</p> <p>We have wiring for under pew heating, however the existing bar heating elements are for frost protection and do not provide any heating for the congregation. The wiring has been checked by Carters, our nominated electrical contractor, and would be suitable for up to date heaters, as per quote.</p>
SK-2238	Jubilee Church	Grantham	£2647	<p>To replace an air source heat pump that is over 15 years old and came out of St Wulfram's school just before it was demolished that is no longer working as we need this space to extend our free English lessons to refugees and asylum seekers to meet increased demand.</p>
SK-2239	St Stephens Church	Carlby	£2000	<p>Mains water connection, an internal all access toilet cubicle and servery with storage cupboard. Relocation of stone font to south east aisle. Making building fit for 2025 use by all village community and beyond for services, concerts, exhibitions, floral displays, lectures, arts activities and performances.</p>
SK-2240	Skillington Parish Council	Grantham	£320	<p>Replacement general notice board which is used by the whole community. The current notice board is very old, and repair attempts have been made but it is beyond repair. The board will be used to bring information to the residents of Skillington, with notices such as published timetables, library dates. Other groups may also use the board to publicise their events.</p>
