Please summarise your concerns about this application:
<p>This objection notice is in relation to a temporary event notice (TEN) for the licensable activity of the sale of alcohol from the 1st July 2026 to the 5th July 2026 from 0800hrs to 2300hrs each day, to allow the premises to operate as an off-licence. This TEN was received by Lincolnshire Police on the 16th June 2026. The notice explains it has been submitted whilst a new premises licence application is in process. The notice giver is Mr Subramaniam Sivatharan.</p> <p>A new premises licence was subsequently received by Lincolnshire Police on the 15th June 2026, with the notice giver listed as both the proposed Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor. Two further TENs were also received from Mr Sivatharan for the same premises, for the same purpose. One was rejected by SKDC due to being submitted too late, and another - a 'late' TEN for the period of the 20th to the 21st June 2026 was received by Lincolnshire Police on the 12th June 2026. This will be objected to separately, meaning a counter notice will be issued.</p>

Lincolnshire Police has had no dialogue with the notice giver concerning any of the TENs or the new premises licence application prior to their submission.

The Lincolnshire Police Licensing Team have been heavily involved with the premises over the last 7 months and this ultimately led to a licence review hearing in May 2026 where the previous premises licence was revoked by the SKDC Licensing Committee.

The police had had various concerns regarding the management of the premises and its activities over the last year, which prompted a series of attempted licence transfers and DPS variations. Lincolnshire Police made multiple objections, and the applications were either withdrawn or refused by SKDC at hearing (17/02/26). Two of the individuals involved with the premises at the time were brothers, Mr Nirusan Sivatharan and Mr Nivethan Sivatharan. Mr Subramaniam Sivatharan is clearly a relation to these two males, however not a name the police are aware of as being linked to the business.

As this TEN was submitted without any prior consultation, it does not give the Police sufficient time to research Mr Subramaniam Sivatharan, fully understand his involvement in the business and establish if he is a suitable person to be responsible for the sale of alcohol, given the premises past poor history and Police concerns.

The 3 working days in which Police can object to a TEN is not enough time to receive sufficient information back from checks made with other responsible authorities, therefore there is a clear risk to the licensing objectives.

Lincolnshire Police have not had the opportunity to meet with Mr Sivatharan to gauge his intention, experience, knowledge and suitability to operate an off-licence. It is recognised that he does appear to hold a personal licence, but this qualification alone does not satisfy Police confidence in his ability to uphold the licensing objectives at what has been a problematic premises historically.

The TEN notice states, *'the premises undertakes to follow the current operating schedule'* but gives no further detail and certainly does not offer any meaningful reassurances. It hasn't been made clear what the 'operating schedule' referred to is.

A TEN permits licensable activity, but no conditions can be attached to promote the licensing objectives, unlike a premises licence, unless at hearing and then only the conditions which are on a premises licence at that location if one exists. In this case, no premises licence for the location currently exists.

No information has been offered on this TEN to offer any reassurances that the premises user has any knowledge about the location and the associated risks.

Lincolnshire Police object to this TEN as it considers the risk to the licensing objectives too high, by not having any enforceable conditions in an off-sale style premises selling alcohol by a notice giver who has not evidenced their understanding of the Licensing Act 2003, or the past concerns Police have had in relation to the premises.

Lincolnshire Police request that the notice giver considers withdrawing this TEN which will require a hearing, to allow sufficient time for the necessary checks to be made.
